Career and Transition Manager Cindy Johnson said, "Our goal is to really help our men and women build a circle of support, and to really flourish in building family and friendships." This is one of the reasons we see a success rate above 80% from those who have graduated from Shepherd's Door or The Harbor over the last 5 years. Since I graduated in January of 2016, I've explored a career in tech, I got my master's degree in education, and I was hired by the Portland Public School District as a full-time teacher.
