
# OVERCOMING A Hopeless Condition



After 30 years of instability and addiction, Terry came to an uncomfortable conclusion. "I realized that I have no structure. I have nowhere to go, and no one wants to be around me. It's misery... just a hopeless condition." Thankfully there was one person in Terry's life who could point him in the right direction, and that direction was to join Portland Rescue Mission's recovery program at The Harbor.

"I knew they were friendly the first time somebody came up and offered me coffee. Something inside of me said, "Look, you came here for help so trust them." That's when everything changed for Terry. "It's like freedom. I found out through coming to The Harbor that I thrive with support, which is something that I've never had. I enjoy being a part of a thriving community where we help each other. When one person's down, we lift them up and pray for them."

# 20 YEAR IN REVIEW 21 Providing Hope Through Partnership

Despite 2021 being a year of challenges and setbacks, at Portland Rescue Mission 2021 will be remembered as another year of relentless compassion. It was a year that saw New Life Program participants at The Harbor and Shepherd's Door overcoming addiction and transitioning into stable housing and employment with 78% of New Life Graduates in the

past 5 years remaining addictions-free and in housing. Shepherd's Door moms were reunited with their children; families restored; and dangerous generational cycles broken. Thank you for your partnership in providing hope and opportunities for a new start for our neighbors suffering from hunger, homelessness, and addiction.
