At Portland Rescue Mission 2022 will be remembered as another year of relentless compassion. It was a year that saw New Life Program participants at The Harbor and Shepherd's Door overcoming addiction and transitioning into stable housing and employment with **85% of New Life Graduates in the past 5 years remaining addictions-free and in housing.**
