Homelessness is not just an economic issue.

After 26 years in Rescue ministry, I can tell you that most of the people I've served who are struggling with homelessness have experienced significant trauma leading to homelessness, the inevitable trauma that comes with homelessness, or both, And mental health challenges. And severe addiction issues that make it difficult to hold a job or maintain relationships. All of which leads to isolation.

That is why shelter and housing without community is insufficient. Community is needed for healing, relational development, job training, addictions recovery, mental health support, and life restoration.

The doors of our Burnside Shelter remain open 24/7/365 to offer more than shelter, more than meals. Since 1949 Portland Rescue Mission has been here to offer a healing community that meets people where they are and offers them hope, training, and assistance off the streets. Our New Life Recovery Program serves up to 125 men, women, and children. About 85% of the men and women who've graduated from our New Life Program over the last 5 years are housed and addictions-free. But the good news doesn't end there. Children are reunited with their mothers. Participants and graduates chose to serve others.

As you will see in our New Life update (page 3) and Avery's story (page 6), that hope spreads. It's contagious, and it makes our community a better place.

Oregon is ranked first in the nation for chronic homelessness according to the 2022 HUD Annual Homelessness assessment. The 2023 Point in Time count lists 6,297 people struggling with homelessness in Multnomah County alone.



In addition to offering shelter for hundreds each night, Portland Rescue Mission has implemented a HOPE VAN outreach to those not able to access services at our Burnside Shelter.



Oregon is ranked first in the nation for the problem of substance use disorders according to the 2023 National Drug Helpline assessment. The Oregon Health Authority reports a 600% increase in the number of fentanyl overdose deaths in Oregon between 2019 and 2021.



About 85% of the people who have graduated from Portland Rescue Mission's New Life Recovery Program over the last 5 years are housed and addictions-free.



There is a tremendous **loss of hope** being experienced not only by those suffering from homelessness and addiction, but by the community at large.



Staff and hundreds of volunteers share hope and offer restorative services to thousands of our neighbors each year at our 24/7 Burnside Shelter and our New Life Recovery Programs.

A Time to Mend Avery's Story of Hope

When Avery lost his mother at age 12, he needed reassurance. He needed to know he would be cared for. He needed a safe place to express his feelings. That is not what he found when he moved in with his dad and stepmother. He was surrounded by addiction, abuse, and trauma. By the time he was 18 he took what comfort he could find in his own addiction. "I think I did that more to just protect myself than anything," he said.

"I lived in a basement room where you'd be afraid to step on a needle," Avery shared. "I was lonely, I was isolated, and my **addiction was out of control."** Thankfully the sister of his dad's girlfriend knew about Portland Rescue Mission, having graduated from the Shepherd's Door Program herself. "I remember people coming up to me in the first ten minutes, making me feel welcome, offering me food, bringing me coffee.

All programs at Portland Rescue Mission are provided free of charge to anyone in need – thanks to your compassionate donations. **Thank you!**

I felt like God was telling me, you are exactly where I want you to be right now."

From there, the healing began. "I learned what it means to stay sober, how to build a support network, and I learned a LOT about Jesus!" "It was surreal to have that kind of support." Now that he's graduated, Avery is making a difference in our Service Program. "It's a program extension where I can give back by working with the guys in the program, creating community, going on hikes, things like that."



And what's next for Avery?

"I know I'm going to do something to help people."
